4) Response to 1NT with a 5 cards minor, 4 cards major and a G.F. hand

Holding a 4 cards major, the priority is to look for a possible fit in the major. Our first bid is therefore the ambiguous 2.

If North rebid shows a fit in our 4 cards major, we would conclude at 4 in that major. If instead North bids $2 \bullet$ or bids the major we do not have, we shall bid $3 \clubsuit$ = asking for minors

We have 4 different cases :

North has shown 4 cards in • and therefore cannot have a 5 cards minor or else he would have 2 doubletons or 1 singleton. It has also to be noted that North has promised 4• but he has not denied 4. The 3 bid asking for minors can also be used, over a 2• response, to enquire whether opener holds also 4. In this way the balanced hand will always remain declarer thus receiving the lead.

Once again South, knowing North shape, will be able to decide the final contract.
